NEW DELHI: (AGENCY)

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Monday spoke to Iranian President Ebrahim Raisi regarding the ongoing conflict between Israel and Hamas. The leaders shared their viewpoints on the challenging circumstances in West Asia resulting from the conflict. With a shared aim of reinstating peace and stability in the region, Modi and Raisi discussed strategies to prevent further escalation. Taking on to X (formerly Twitter) PM Modi wrote, "Good exchange of perspectives with President @rsi_iran of Iran on the difficult situation in West Asia and the Israel-Hamas conflict. Terrorist incidents, violence and loss of civilian lives are serious concerns. Preventing escalation, ensuring continued human-



tarian aid and early restoration of peace and stability are important. Welcomed the progress in our bilateral cooperation, including on the Chabahar port." Earlier, PM Modi also spoke to Egyptian President Abdel Fattah El-Sisi and dis-

cussed the dangers of the escalating Israeli military operations in the Gaza Strip. The two leaders exchanged their views on the threats posed by the ongoing war between Israel and Hamas. The PM also had a telephone conversation with His

Majesty King Abdullah II of Jordan regarding on October 23 where expressed concerns about terrorism, violence, and the loss of civilian lives. In a surprise attack on October 7 attack by Hamas approximately 2,500 terrorists

"Goa CM accuses Congress and BRS of being two sides of the same coin

HYDERABAD : (AGENCY)

Accusing both Congress and BRS of being two sides of the same coin, Goa Chief Minister Pramod Sawant appealed to the people of Telangana to give the BJP a chance to form the government, emphasising their proven credibility over time. He stated that only the BJP can do justice to the youth, women, and farmers. Speaking to reporters here on Monday, Pramod Sawant expressed that the sacrifices of 1,200 youth instrumental in the formation of Telangana would be recognised, and their families would be addressed once the BJP comes to power in the state. He accused the Congress party of being responsible for their deaths and highlighted that the BJP has formed three states without any bloodshed. Sawant criticized the BRS Government for failing to deliver on the promise of Neelu Nidhulu Niymakalu for which the people had agitated and mentioned that these

promises were not fulfilled. He described the BRS as the embodiment of corruption, commission, and communal riots, creating a Congress-like situation. He called the Kaleshwaram project the biggest scam and referred to the government as a "leakage government." He pointed out that the government had failed to complete recruitments even after conducting 17 tests, which he described as an injustice to the youth and unemployed of Telangana. Sawant also asserted that if Congress wins the elections, its candidates will join the BRS, a pattern proven in the past. He indicated that the MIM supports them and asserted that Congress and BRS are essentially two sides of the same coin.

He encouraged the BJP a chance to form a government that prioritizes development, citing the fulfillment of promises like the Turmeric Board and Tribal University, as well as various schemes and benefits extended to Telangana, despite non-cooperation from the State Government.

MP : Priyanka smiles on hearing witty comment against Adani

Congress General Secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra could not suppress her smile on Monday in the context of a clever remark - regarding tycoon Gautam Adani - by a member of the audience during a rally in this town of election-bound Madhya Pradesh's Dhar district. While addressing the public meeting, the visiting leader asked, "Who is the country's biggest industrialist?" Adani, the crowd responded, "Kya koi mujhe bata sakte hai ki woh kya banate hain? (Can anyone tell me what he manufactures?) Cars, toothpaste, pillars, loudspeakers or cement?" Mrs Priyanka queried, "Bewakoof banate hain. (He makes fools of others)." came the reply. Continuing her speech, the Congress General Secretary said, "Public assets and government industries were given to him for peanuts. Loans worth thousands of crores were waived. Certain people desire to remain in power to perpetrate corruption and make patches for themselves."

Their regimes are running for tycoons. Mr Adani rakes in Rs 1,600 crore a day with the help of the government and in stark contrast the hapless peasant earns a paltry Rs 27. Mr Modi's suits cost lakhs and he travels in an aircraft purchased for Rs 8,000 crores but cannot waive agrarian debt. Like the kings of yore, they are snatching all your rights," she added.

Mizoram votes Tuesday to elect 40-member Assembly

AIZAWL (AGENCY)

India's tiny North Eastern state of Mizoram goes to the polls on Tuesday with an electorate of 3,56,863 spread across 1,276 polling stations eligible to choose a 40-member Assembly from a pool of 170 candidates.

State Chief Electoral Officer (CEO), Madhup Vyas said that



the stage is set for voting amidst a thick security blanket and multiple tech-driven measures to ensure free, fair and peaceful polls. Voting will begin at 7 am and continue till 4 pm in India's second least populated and fifth smallest state. There are 29 vulnerable polling stations and one critical polling station, mainly along the international and international border areas across the state. The CEO said there are 4,39,026 female voters and 4,975 service voters in the state. He said webcasting will be

undertaken in 769 (60 per cent) of the polling stations. Besides 3,000 odd state police personnel, 450 sections of central armed police forces (CAPF) are being deployed to prevent any breach of peace. There are 21 general observers, 14 expenditure observers and 11 police observers to oversee the polling process. Mizoram Election department officials said that there are 19 villages in the state where water transport is required. State Additional Chief Electoral Officer H. Lianzela said that such villages only accessible by boat are in southern Mizoram's Lunglai and Lawngtlai districts and Mizoram-Tripura-Bangladesh border Mamit district.

There are also 22 polling stations where polling parties have to move by foot. The villages are located in Lunglai district (11), Mamit district (6) and Lawngtlai district (5). Though the number of candidates is 170, four of them are contesting from two assembly seats each. The ruling Mizo National Front (MNF), the Zoram People's Movement (ZPM) and the Congress are contesting all the assembly seats while the BJP is in fray in 23 seats and the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) nominees are fighting.

Nepal earthquake : Thousands of people rendered homeless, survivors await aid

Thousands of people rendered homeless after Friday's earthquake in Nepal's mountainous region are facing a shortage of food, clothes and medicines as relief materials and help are yet to reach several places. The survivors of the catastrophe cremated their deceased relatives on Sunday.

Hasta Bahadur KC of Chirurol of Nalgad Municipality in Jajarkot is mourning the loss of his son, his daughter-in-law, and his four-year-old grandson. His son, Bhimsen BK, had come home for the Dashain (Vijaya Dashami) festival and had planned to return to India where he worked.

Bhimsen, his wife and son were among 157 people killed after a 6.4 magnitude quake with the epicentre at Jajarkot's Ramindra jolted Nepal on Friday. The tremors were also felt in parts of India, including Delhi and the National Capital Region. "Only my wife and I remain. The two of us have been living under a tarpaulin tent since Friday midnight. We are yet to come to terms with our loss," The Kathmandu Post newspaper quoted Hasta Bahadur as saying.

According to Suresh BK,



resident of Chirurol, 13 people lost their lives in the village while several others were injured in the earthquake. At least 56 houses in the village were completely destroyed while 110 houses, although still standing, have become inhabitable, said Suresh.

"But so far, we have not received any. All our crops, grains, food, clothes and other valuables lie buried in the debris. We haven't been able to retrieve anything as there are no security personnel to help us," said Suresh. "It is unbearably cold outside and none of us have had any sleep since Friday night." The victims of the earthquake in Bheri Municipality, where several villages were affected, are also waiting for help and relief materials. Chandra Prakash Gharti, mayor of Bheri Municipality, said that the local unit is collecting data to streamline relief

distribution, which has caused delays in dispatching relief materials immediately to the affected villages. "Preliminary assessment of the damage is now complete. We will start the distribution of relief materials in the affected areas on Monday with the help of security personnel," said Gharti.

The earthquake victims are in need of immediate help and blame the govern-

ment for delayed response even during emergencies. Kalawati Singh, a local survivor in Chirurol said that after two nights out in the cold, the villagers have started to fall sick.

"Elderly people and young children are falling ill. We don't have warm clothes and have been spending our days and nights in the open field," the newspaper quoted Singh as saying. "There are no doctors or any medical help here. We have food left for a maximum of two days. We hope more help will soon arrive." Karna Bahadur BK, a local of Aasthikot Municipality who lost his 27-year-old cousin on Friday night, said that managing tarpaulin, blankets and food for the surviving members of the family is proving difficult with each passing day.
